We live life within a storm Life----in space-time----passes In the end,thunder sounds----lightning flashes Ones atomic self rejoins elemental dances.


## **Master Thieves**



## **Honky-Tonk Renaissance**

Waylon Jennings is alive.

Figuratively. Not literally, folks. Strolling down Haywood Road in West Asheville, North Carolina one lazy summer evening, I came across the Double Crown. A dive bar of the most enjoyable proportions, it's a place you feel as welcomed as the beer is cold.

I heard a booming sound echo out of the front door and onto the busy thorough-fare. Someone was taking their bass guitar for a stroll, as the kick drums, pedal steel and guitar chugged along with a fiery presence. Stepping across the threshold of the Double Crown, I turned to the corner stage as a larger-than-life voice howled from the microphone. It was Whitey Morgan & The 78s — a honky-tonk band of honesty, grit and soul, everything Jennings represented.

With a tone that would steal your girl-friend and drink all of your beer in a single song, but also give you the shirt off their back, the Flint, Michigan group has been traversing the country for the better part of a decade. During that time, they have attracted legions of fans thirsty for something more Merle Haggard and Willie Nelson, and less Luke Bryan and Blake Shelton.

Morgan and his boys recently put out "Sonic Ranch," their latest release filled with the usual helping of razor-sharp pedal steel and backcountry rock-n-roll. The record is just another step in an already bountiful ca-

reer, one seemingly destined to achieve their goal of simply bringing good music to good people.

Morgan spoke about being on the road, how Kickstarter was the way to go for launching the album, and why Jennings would be rolling over in his grave if he tuned into a modern country radio station.

**Garret K. Woodward:** What's your definition of country music?

Whitey Morgan: It's a sound, a way of life, mostly. That's the way it started out in the old days when my family was up around here in these mountains. It's definitely what it's not today on the damn radio. I don't even like the label "country" music anymore. I hate the label "outlaw," it doesn't mean today what it meant back then. People today think an outlaw musician is someone who is loud and an asshole onstage, that's not an outlaw, that's just an asshole. We're a honky-tonk band.

**GKW:** If Waylon Jennings were alive today, what would he say about modern country music?

WM: He said the same stuff back in the day when he was alive. He knew it back then, it was changing. The thing is, today I'd even take Garth Brooks over any of these guys on the radio any day of the week. I don't get it. I don't come from that world. I call it "frat country." It's just pop music that they throw a little twang in it, a fiddle, and call it country. I don't get it. I get so tired when people say

there isn't any country music anymore. It's like walking out of the Olive Garden in the middle of Manhattan and saying there's no good Italian food in New York City. Go look for it. It's not going to be there right for you. Go find it

**GKW:** You used Kickstarter to get the new album released.

**WM:** I got sick of my label. They weren't doing for me what I wasn't already doing on my own, and I was giving them money. It got kind of old. They are a good label for other artists, but I expect more. I come from a hard working background. I work hard for every dollar and I don't just give it away to someone that just claims they're doing their fair share. I just love to tour and make fans that appreciate what we're doing, and appreciate the old types of music and genres I like.

**GKW:** What has a life playing music taught you about being a human being?

WM: I've grown up a lot on the road, that's for sure. It's taught me to not take shit for granted, to appreciate every day. There are people out there that will never see a tiny fraction of the things I've seen and the places I've been. I used to be a real introvert, real quiet and shy in public. Now, I just fall in love with every town we go to. A lot of hard work has happened so far, and there's a lot of hard work that it's going to take to bring it to the next level. The shows are getting bigger. I've never felt a downhill. It's always going uphill,

slowly, but always going uphill.

# The Rustic Riders (Lisa& Klaus Meissner)

"Hey, looks like the whole earth catalog!" Was my first thought when i laid eyes on the rustic riders latest cd,wake up! It's a collection of 13 songs written and sung by lisa meissner, who along with her husband klaus on percussion, and occasional help from friends, perform as the rustic riders. They live off the beaten path, in between saranac lake and tupper lake, ny, and the beauty that surrounds them certainly influences much of their material.

Lost dog opens the cd. A blues number, which is somewhat of a departure from lisa's established style; it's got some cute and catchy lyrics. A defiant woman who won't be under any man's thumb. "I ain't your lost dog, i'm the one who got away". A tasty slide guitar line provided by dan duggan, adds to its credibility. Chicken soup is nice, an ode to older nurturing women, comes next. There are several underlying themes that run through this recording. One of them is an appreciative contemplation of elders; the previous generations. Someday continues in that vein. With it comes the realization that we keep moving up the age ladder ourselves and we will be the next round of elders. Time and tides stand still for no man. Susan grimm hanley embellishes the melody with her delightful flute part

The riders go gospel with the title track, wake up. The song is a call to environmental and personal awareness, and the lively "hoe-down" country music pulls you right in to sing along. The rustic riders often use inspirational lyrics and phrases from the bible, in their songs. Unlike some rightwing "christians", they get the stewardship thing, or so it seems to me. As a whole, the even more prominent theme that runs through wake

up is the celebration of "sustainability" as envisioned the likes of bill mckibben. Small farms is a happy ode to the upswing in eating local, farmers markets, low impact sustenance farms and communalism.

Lisa says she started writing the storm is coming as hurricane irene approached. But the song transcends any particular storm and metaphorically covers the ways people, communities, and friends and family band together to weather the storms of life

Drop in the bucket is a straight out tip of the hat to bill mckibben and his book eaarth , making a life on a tough planet. If you're not familiar with mckibben and his organization, 350.0rg, here's a link to the ny times review of it. Read it, and the whole cd will take on a profound and cohesive tone.

The next song, keeping time, which grew out of the adirondack rocking festival, is a sweet song that sets you out an adirondack porch in a rocking chair. It's one of my favorite cuts. The imagery is soothing and welcoming. Dancing in heaven is a touching reflection klaus and lisa's parents. It's quite a story. Traveling reminds us that nothing is static in life.

Holy ground again merges the sacred and the common. This is a review of some music and poetry, not a theological debate, but i must say that i find meissner's outlook refreshing. The rustic riders use common understandable words and similitudes to argue out some pretty lofty (or perhaps deep)concepts.

Shine your light is a straight out gospel song.

The final tune, take me, deserves its place among the best on the burgeoning adirondack folk scene. Mostly unknown by the rest of the music world, there is a rich vein of distinct music developing in these northern mountains. It's a style



that combines celtic, traditional american folk, french canadian, and other gendres with lyrics mined from the colors and light and wilderness found in this isolated region.

Wake up! Is more than just an "adirondack folk" album, though it is every bit that. It's an exercise in "right thinking". On the ground floor, it's an

enjoyable folk/americana recording, with pleasant and talented musicianship. Like an onion, it has multiple layers. Sometimes we have to hit the snooze button a few times before we hear the wake up! Call. This cd can be purchased through itunes, via the rustic riders' website or at ampersound in saranac lake..

## CD Review: You Keep The Money By Tas Cru

Having followed the career of veteran bluesman Tas Cru from his early days with the Conrad Story Blues Band to his career as a solo artist. and having seen him perform live in many small clubs in northern New York, and having listened to all of his recordings, I'm pleased to say that with this latest CD, You Keep the Money, Cru has achieved world-class status as a guitarist, as a singer, and as a songwriter.

Not only has he grown and evolved as a musician, but Tas Cru has the good sense to surround himself with an excellent backup band. The current incarnation is called The Moneymakers, and it consists of the following: Mary Ann Casale and Alice (Honeybea) Ericksen on backing vocals, Dick Ericksen on red-hot harmonica, Cru's longtime pal Chip Lamson on piano, Guy Nirelli on organ, Bob Purdy on bass, and Dave Olson and Bob Holz alternating on drums, with Ron Keck helping out on percussion. This is a tight ensemble.

In You Keep the Money you get a dozen songs and nearly one hour of solid blues. The thing with Tas Cru, both recorded and live, is the broad dynamic range of every aspect of the performance. In his songwriting, Cru pens jocular blues rockers like "Heart Trouble" and "One Bad Habit," a beautiful guitar instrumental "La Belle Poutine," and the agonizing lament, "Thinking How to Tell Me Goodbye," as well as a real love song, "Holding on to You," and the energy-brimming title track, "You Keep the Money." He can make his guitar gasp and whimper, then the next moment scream and howl. His rich growly voice can get low, smooth or gritty, then roar like an anguished blues master from the past. By the way, the CD production—recorded at SubCat Music Studios in Syracuse, New York, engineered by Ron Keck and mastered by Patrick MacDougall—is superb.

And he can definitely reproduce all of this live. I saw Tas Cru perform recently at the renovated Russell Theater in Russell, New York, with Mary Ann Casale. In the first set, they alternated singing his songs and hers. Both played acoustic guitar, and Mary Ann also played dulcimer. We were lucky enough to have second row seats, the perfect vantage point from which to observe a real professional, one who enjoys pleasing his audience. In the second set, they played songs by Bonnie Raitt, Rod Stewart, J.J. Cale, Peter, Paul, and Mary, and more, plus a haunting version of George and Ira Gershwin's "Summertime." I've never seen a man attack an acoustic guitar like Tas Cru. His notes are precise and clean, moonlight-smooth and soulful, and they can kick you out of your chair if necessary.

I'm writing this on September 23rd, 2015. Tonight Tas Cru and his band (The Tortured Souls) play a gig in Williamsburg, Virginia, after which they continue their tour down through North Carolina, Alabama, and into Florida. The make plans accordingly. plan is to be up in Ontario, Canada, by Halloween. At some future point Tas Cru and his band will be back in New York, and I strongly suggest that you

# **Amy**

Amy, the docunentary about the six time Grammy winner Amy Winehouse (one win posthumously) is a riveting, yet deeply sad tale of fame and

addiction. Director Asif Kapadia's film is so intimate and vivid, it is as if Amy has never died and she is alive and ready to write another album. Alas, she isn't and Winehouse's spiral down not only seems inevitable from the beginning of her fame, but inevitable from the beginning of her life. The sadness of this is ineffable, as her talent was alarmingly singular.

Born into a middle-class Jewish family in North London, Amy was musically inclined at an early age. Several of her uncles were jazz musicians, her grandmother was a singer. She was prodigious and writing music as an early teen. A child of divorce and questionable, if not bad parenting, Amy certainly had little discipline and authority as a child. She walked all over her parents as a child and perhaps these loose boundaries contributed to her addiction proclivities. Regardless, her addictive behavior seemed to be almost innate.

There are no filmed interviews with Winehouse's family, friends or professional colleagues. There are voice over excerpts from interviews, but the talking heads that are a staple of documentaries, just don't happen here. They aren't needed, because there are so many videos and photographs of Amy, especially after her fame soared, that you will know her well without commentary from people in her life. She lived in a fishbowl.

Meteoric fame is challenging for anyone, but especially difficult for someone like Amy, who had always struggled with balance. Add the notoriously rabid and predatory British press and paparazzi and the marketing of Amy as a rock star, when she was really a Jazz singer and you have a tragedy in the making. The footage of the Serbian concert where Amy was unable to perform because she was so drunk is startling. Amy wanted to write music and perform in intimate venues. She had no desire to be a Rock Star. However musicians in the 21st century make most of their income from concerts and it just seemed logical to promote her

as a star. After all, you cannot be too famous. Or can you? Fame was no solace, if anything it precipitated her demise as it created an unreality that she desired to escape from.

Her substance abuse (cocaine, heroin, meth and of course alcohol) and her bulimia weakened her greatly physically, but her bad choice in men certainly didn't help. Her dream man was an opportunist who was convicted of a crime and served jail time. However, even he couldn't handle the mess that Amy had become near the end. He divorced her.

Messy, high-maintenance, vulnerable, difficult to love, wounded, but immensely talented Amy is definitely the portrait of a tortured artist. Without Amy being Amy songs like "Rehab," "You Know I'm No Good" and "Back to Black" would not be part of our musical canon. Yes it is a tragedy, but it is a tragedy that has left shinning, inimitable music behind. Amy was real, raw and phenomenally honest and Kapadia's film illuminates and celebrates her, without glorifying her bad girl behavior. It is a must for music fans and especially Winehouse fans.


## **Bring Back the Boys: Using Games** to Re-engage Boys in Learning

THE GAME CONNOISSEUR PROFESSOR OF EDUCATIONAL TECHNOLOGY AND ORGANIZATIONAL LEADERSHIP, **SUNY POTSDAM** 

Dr. Alison Carr-Chellman will be visiting SUNY Potsdam as part of the Bregman Digital Humanities speaker series. She will be giving a one-hour presentation on boys, games, and schools at noon on Friday, October 23 in the Crumb Memorial Llbrary. This speech is open to the public. Ali is a friend and colleague of mine who received her PhD from the Instructional Systems Technology program at Indiana University in 1993, the year before I arrived in the same program. She is now a Professor at Penn State University, serving in the Learning and Performance Systems department in their College of Education. She has had a truly remarkable career, and has developed into a national expert in systemic change and the culture of schools. In 2010 she spoke as part of the Technology, Education, and Design (TED) Talk series. Her topic was "Bring Back the Boys," and in her presentation she outlined the reasons boys are not thriving in schools. She then offered suggestions for making changes that would make schools a better fit for boys. In particular, she cited a number of alarming statistics, including one that showed that the number of male teachers in elementary schools was down to 7% nationwide. She connects the dots, and surmises that the girl-centric culture of our elementary schools more-or-less inevitable, given the drastic female-male ratio on staff. And while she advocates for boys, she is also a strong advocate for an appropriate education for girls, especially in math and science. Other statistics she cites show that boys are suspended more often than girls, labeled with learning disabilities more often, and ultimately graduating college at a significantly lower rate.
