CD Review

Relentless (2016) Paul DesLauriers Band From Big Toe Productions

Relentless is the perfect word to describe this fearsome blues-rock trio. From the ascending opening bars of "Stewtro Rock (Just Got Back)" to the textured guitar-drums interplay at the close of "Gonna Make You Move (Part 2)," the music charges fearlessly through various blues and rock modes, avoiding clichés while delivering austere power and clanging riff bombs.

First, let's introduce the band. Paul DesLauriers (pronounced "de-loree-yay") leads the group on gritty vocals and fierce lead guitar plus piano and Theremin, backed by Greg Morency on bass and Sam Harrisson on drums and various forms of percussion. Together, these guys form a killer band, evoking for me classic blues combos of the 60s and 70s, like Humble Pie, Bad Company, Savoy Brown, Fog Hat, and Free. Not that the DesLauriers Band is derivative, but rather that they play with the same heated masculine authority as these hearty progenitors, even cranking it up an extra notch. It's interesting to note that the five above named bands hail from the UK, and the DesLauriers Band is from Montreal, Canada.

This is a serious guitar band, the sonic path paved by furious bass and drums. The guitar is urgent, the vocals full and powerful, hiding nothing. One of my problems with too many blues artists is that the listener usually knows what note is coming up soon in any lead; with DesLauriers you never know what's next. He can play it sweet or he can make it shriek, and either way sounds unexpected and right.

Really, every song is superlative. "Still Under My Skin," is a dirty blues number that features wild, exciting guitar. "Wipes Away Your Sin," starts like a march, all thudding drums and thrumming guitar chords. "Up in the Air" is a lean and mean solid blues tune. "We Just Might' is a full charge and gallop right from the opening drum roll, DesLauriers roaring all the way on vox and guitar. And the band writes all their own songs, with help on the lyrics by "longtime collaborator" Alec McElcheran.

In January 2014 Paul DesLauriers was recognized as Canada's top blues guitar player at the 17th Annual Maple Blues Awards ceremony in Toronto. In 2015 each guy was nominated for best on his instrument—and Greg Morency won for bass.

The band is headquartered in Montreal, but DesLauriers is originally from Cornwall, Ontario. Absolutely buy the CD, and keep your eyes open for local performances. Don't be surprised if they blast you out of your chair.







GHOSTS AND THE WEATHER

UINI RESEARCH - DIRECTOR/FOUNDER

GAME CONNOISSEUR

Pokémon GO: Mediocre Game, Cultural Phenomenon

EVERYWHERE I go it seems that people are playing Pokémon GO. In terms of the gameplay itself, it is shallow, unpolished, and buggy, and I have maintained from the beginning that it is a mediocre game at best, a C+ if I were to give it a grade. Reviews at Metacritic are similarly bad, with an average critic rating of at 67/100. And the core game mechanic, walking and catching Pokémon, is repetitive and glitchy. So, that said, why is such a big deal?

First, it has a big franchise behind it. Before Pokémon GO most of us were at least aware of Pokémon, which saw its first game release via Pokémon Red and Green in 1996. I have played a number of these games over the years, with Pokémon Snap for the N-64 being my personal favorite, although they are all generally well designed and enjoyable. Pokémon has always maintained a healthy worldwide following, with

various spikes in popularity corresponding with major card game, video game, movie, or television releases. The characters themselves are well conceived and attractive, and there is an established Pokémon lore that people do not need to decipher to play the game. Pokémon is already both familiar and comfortable for many people, and for those new to the franchise, it is simple and approachable.

Second, and perhaps more importantly, it is the world's first Augmented Reality Game (ARG) to break through and go mainstream. By integrating Google Maps into the core gameplay, the game board is simply our real world, augmented by an overlay of information (Pokémon, Pokéstops, & PokéGyms). And although ARG games have been around for a number of years, for most users Pokémon GO is their first ARG game. The core feature

of ARG is simple: movement and participation in the real world. As simple as that may sound, it really is a big deal, as it gets people moving (and it really is the main reason I play).

And while currently the game may indeed be mediocre, Niantic Labs CEO John Hanke has suggested that the game has only implemented a fraction of features that eventually will make their way into the game. At the San Diego Comic-Con he announced that there will be a significant number of new Pokémon that will be soon introduced to the game. But before that happens, the first order of business for Niantic is to secure a foothold in all of the major countries around the world, and to iron out the technical glitches. Once complete, Hanke has promised new features like trading, Pokémon and Pokéstop customizations, and more team oriented play. In

the meantime, we will need to be patient as the game scales up. Personally, while I look forward to some of these new game features, I more look forward to play balancing and ironing out of known (annoying) glitches, like creatures repeatedly breaking free, Pokéstop fails, and location tracking.

In the end, the formula for Pokémon Go was a relatively simple one, and it will certainly be repeated (and refined) with other core franchises. Solid candidates for future ARG games include Harry Potter, Star Wars, and Disney, among others. If I were to put it in creature terms, Pokémon Go is, right now, essentially a "CP 10 Pidgey" game, with more powerful evolutions certain to come. In terms of its impact on culture, Pokémon Go, and Augmented Reality Gaming in general, is a "CP 2491 Snorlax," and yet it is truly just the beginning.

Captain Fantastic

Captain Fantastic is a highly original, incredibly honest, terrific film. Wedged into a summer of huge blockbusters with enormous budgets, high paid casts and CG action, Captain Fantastic is about real people and very interesting things like: family, conformity, death, literature, independence and parenting. Yet it is highly entertaining and emotionally involving and resonant.

Watertown's own Viggo Mortensen plays Ben, a survivalist father of six who proudly home schools his children and trains them to live off the grid and fend for themselves. This includes killing, gutting and cooking their own food, and physical and mental training to make them as strong and independent as possible. The role of Ben fits Mortensen like

a glove. It's a perfect part for the actor who shuns Hollywood and the limelight and couldn't care less if he were famous. With his craggy, rugged appearance and uncombed hair. he easily could have walked out of the Northwestern woods.

The children's mother is mentally ill and hospitalized, therefore leaving Ben as the sole parent. Soon an incident plummets the family into turmoil and Ben and the children go on a road trip in their funky converted school bus that thrusts them deeply into the society they have shunned and are sorely unfit for. This trip underscores their alarmingly different lifestyle and creates conflict with Ben's sister (Katherine Hahn) and brother-in-law (Steve Zahn) who believe that the children's extreme upbringing is harmful and creates huge disadvantages for their children's futures. Things are worse with the children's wealthy maternal grandparents played by an imposing, always fantastic, Frank Langella and a sympathetic, warm Ann Dowd.

Speaking of the cast, if there was an Oscar for best casting director: Jeanne McCarthy would win. From the impeccable casting of the six children, to every minor role, including a perfectly wry turn by Missy Pyle as the mother of an amorous teenage girl (Erin Moriarty) who has eves for the oldest child in the clan; Bo (a terrific George McKay). Captain Fantastic is such a rich experience it is difficult to write about it, as it can't do justice to its layers and complexity. Writer/director Mat Ross is a remarkable talent, working with a self-effacing hand. He has phenomenal story skills and does amazing work with a large ensemble class. So many scenes feel improvised, so many scenes feel real. With this realness, there is truth and in truth there is power.

We should be proud of our native son, Viggo Mortensen, who not only is enormously talented, but chooses great films that actually have something to say. So far, Captain Fantastic is my pick for best film of 2016.
