Manuel de Falla's El sombrero de tres picos was premiered in 1919 by Sergei Diaghilev's Ballet Russe, with costumes and sets designed by Picasso and choreography by Léonide Massine. The ballet is set in Andalusia, and material both borrowed from and in imitation of Andalusian folk music can be heard throughout de Falla's score. Suite No. 2 consists of three dances from the ballet: the seguidillas, a light and quick dance traditionally in triple time; the farruca, a form of flamenco; and the jota, a dance in 6/8 time typically accompanied by castanets.
