Cullan Bryant is among the most active chamber and collaborative pianists in New York City, maintaining a schedule of over 50 recitals a year. He has performed with such artists as Emanuel Borok, David Geber, Olch Krysa, Midori, Sviatoslav Moroz, Peter Rejto, and Peter Winograd. He has also appeared in recitals with members of the New York Philharmonic, Metropolitan Opera Orchestra, the Orchestra of St. Luke's, New York City Ballet Orchestra, New Jersey Symphony, Boston Symphony and the Detroit Symphony Orchestra in such venues as Weill Recital Hall, Merkin Hall, Alice Tully Hall, the Metropolitan Museum of Arts, and Detroit's Orchestra Hall. Mr. Bryant made his Carnegie Hall debut in 1992 in recital with violinist Patmore Lewis. Shelly Tramposh and Cullan Bryant have performed together since 2007. Their CD "Sprezzatura" was praised by Gramophone as "a disc that ought to hold appeal far beyond the viola community."
