He has performed with many ensembles at Crane including the Wind Ensemble, the Concert and Symphonic bands, the Crane Symphony Orchestra, Jazz Ensemble, Latin Ensemble, and the Contemporary Music Ensemble. He has also worked extensively with the Crane Opera Ensemble as a rehearsal pianist for the past three years.

In December of 2010, his jazz playing brought him the great opportunity of playing in a student jazz quintet alongside Wynton Marsalis in New York City when SUNY Potsdam conferred upon him an honorary doctorate degree in music education. He has played in masterclasses for members of the Brad Mehldau Trio, the Count Basie Orchestra, and the former Tito Puente Orchestra.

As a member of the Latin Ensemble, he traveled to Mexico during the summers of 2010 and 2011 as part of partnership forming programs between SUNY Potsdam, Universidad Autónoma del Estado de Hidalgo, and Universidad de las Americas Puebla. Compositions of his, "Tequila Mockingbird" and "The Prodigal Son Returns From His Calamitous Space Adventures," were featured during both tours.
