Through the Syracuse-based Society for New Music, Dr. Wanamaker is a recipient of a 2011 National Endowment for the Arts Access to Artistic Excellence Grant in support of an upcoming collaboration with photographer and visual artist Carrie Mae Weems.

Wanamaker is currently Professor of Composition and Theory at The Crane School of Music at SUNY Potsdam.

His principal composition teachers were Ladislav Kubík, William Averitt, and Thomas Albert.
