BIOGRAPHY

Jonathan Moyer

Jonathan William Moyer maintains a dynamic career as organist, pianist and conductor. He is the music director and organist of the Church of the Covenant in Cleveland, Ohio. He has performed throughout the northeastern United States, Europe, and Japan and has performed piano and chamber music recitals at the La Gesse Music Festival in Toulouse, France, and Weill Recital Hall in New York City.

In September 2008, he received the second prize in the Sixth International Musashino Organ Competition in Tokyo, Japan. The Baltimore Sun said of his second of four 2008 recitals of the complete organ works of Olivier Messiaen, "Moyer revealed the composer's musical genius as vividly as his spiritual richness, taking full advantage of the cathedral's Shantz organ. . . . Passages of rapt reflection were shaped with a keen sense of import."

Mr. Moyer is a doctoral candidate in organ as a student of Donald Sutherland at the Peabody Conservatory of Music (Baltimore).

Mr. Moyer resides in Shaker Heights, Ohio, along with his wife, Kaori Hongo, and son, Christopher Sho.

Kaori Hongo

Kaori Hongo, organist and native of Japan, attended Westminster Choir College of Rider University as an undergraduate student of Donald McDonald, where she received the Alexander McCurdy Award in Organ Performance. After completing her Master's degree in organ at the Peabody Conservatory as a student of Donald Sutherland, Ms. Hongo attended the Rueil-Malmaison Conservatoire in France, where she received the Deuxieme Prix de Niveau Superieur in 1999. She is currently completing a Doctor of Musical Arts Degree in organ at the Peabody Conservatory.

She has served as organist and choir director at First English Evangelical Lutheran Church, Baltimore, and the Church of the Advent (Episcopal), Baltimore. Ms. Hongo is an active member of the American Guild of Organists and has served on the executive board of the Baltimore Chapter.
