Born in Odessa on the Black Sea, Victoria Mushkatkol made her concert debut with the Kiev Philharmonic Orchestra at the age of ten. After graduating from Kiev Music School for Gifted Children, she went on to study at the St. Petersburg Conservatory with Professor Vladimir Nielsen, one of Russia's most eminent piano teachers, graduating from the Conservatory with the highest honors.

Ms. Mushkatkol returned to Russia in recent years when she performed at Gnesin Institute in Moscow and Museum of Music, Sheremetiev Palace, in St.-Petersburg as well as guest performer and master class teacher as part of the festival International Conservatory week in St.-Petersburg.

She is a founder and Artistic Director of Vladimir Nielsen Piano Festival in Sag Harbor, New York since 2007.

Currently Victoria Mushkatkol resides in New York and is on the faculty of Juilliard School
